Components

Junk:

- Glass ornamental container, seashells, twigs, soil.

Idea:

- Create a sustainable environment to grow orchids in any weather
 - Can be sold as a standard kit, off the shelf
- Almost no maintenance required to breed orchids indoors or near windows



Prototype

Notes: Orchids cannot survive in wet soil. Only accepts humidity and half of the morning sun. Frost and arid air will kill it. Peat is used to maintain humidity. Shells are soaked in fertilizer, as a sort of timed release food source. Twigs buffer peat from plant.

■ Seashells and snail shells [absorb H₂O]

■ Twig layer

■ Peat or Dirt
